## 2 from Randolph killed in Pike crash in Westborough

WESTBOROUGH - Two people from Randolph were killed and two others seriously injured early Thursday morning when a pickup struck their car and rolled over onto it on the Massachusetts Turnpike in Westborough.

State police and emergency personnel from Westborough and Grafton were called to the scene at 3:17 a.m. Police said a 2002 Honda Accord, with five people in it, had been moving slowly because of a flat tire, when a 2011 Dodge Ram pickup, towing a boat trailer, clipped the Honda and rolled over onto it.

Late Thursday, state police identified the two people killed as Clarice Felix, 18, and Dave Virgile, 27, both from Randolph. Police said both were pronounced dead at the scene. Two other passengers suffered serious injuries and were taken to UMass Medical Center in Worcester. State police identified them as Gregory Marcelin, a 20-year-old from East Weymouth, and Monique Sheppard, 20, of Roxbury. The driver of the Honda, Bryant Brezil, a 19-year-old from Randolph, sustained minor injuries, police said.

Police said the driver of the Dodge, 24-year-old Zachary Tucker of Deerfield, New Hampshire, was treated by EMTs and released at the scene of the crash. Police said they did not yet know why the Dodge hit the Honda.

Westborough Fire Department Capt. Stephen Doucet said the collision happened near the Grafton border on the eastbound side of the Pike.

The crash is under investigation by Troop E of the state police, with the assistance of the state police Collision Analysis and Reconstruction Section, and the state police crime scene services section.

Elsewhere, a crash early New Year's Day in Rockland killed a 17-year-old Rockland High School student and send another person to the hospital with injuries, Plymouth County District Attorney Timothy J. Cruz said.

Patrick Sullivan was killed in the three-car collision around 2:50 a.m. Two other people involved were not injured.

The DA's office said Sullivan was the driver of a 2005 Toyota Highlander that landed on its roof in the southbound lane. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

First responders also found a 2011 Nissan Sentra resting against a tree near the southbound shoulder and a 2004 Mitsubishi Galant located nearby. The operator of the Nissan was transported to South Shore Hospital in South Weymouth with non-life threatening injuries. The two occupants of the Mitsubishi were not injured.

According to Cruz's office, witnesses said the Nissan had been driving on the wrong side of the road, side-by-side with the Toyota before the crash. The Mitsubishi struck the Toyota when it was already overturned.

Local and state police are still investigating.
